# Our Catchments Our Communities

OCOC is Victoria's first state-wide Integrated Catchment Management (ICM) Strategy.

OCOC supports the implementation of waterway and catchment health directions in *Water for Victoria*, particularly "Invest in integrated catchment management".

#### **Purpose of OCOC**

- Strengthen the catchment management framework
- Improve partnerships & accountability
- Support on-ground delivery to achieve ICM outcomes

#### **OCOC** Directions

- Goal 1. Effective community engagement in catchment management
- Goal 2. Better connections between state, regional and local planning
- Goal 3. Strengthened implementation of Regional Catchment Strategies
- Goal 4. Clearer roles, strengthened accountability and coordination
- Goal 5. Improved monitoring, evaluation and reporting



#### *Implementation*

#### **Goal 1** – Effective community engagement in catchment management

- Diversity and inclusion in participation and decision making
- New Catchments Leadership Development Grants program under way

#### Goal 2 – Better connections between state, regional & local planning

- State and regional policies reviewed to understand opportunities/barriers
- Planning next generation NRM plans/ Regional Catchment Strategies

#### **Goal 3** – Strengthened implementation of Regional Catchment Strategies

- 19 new on-ground Integrated Catchment Management projects to support RCS implementation commenced (\$16m over four years).
- Strengthened regional engagement (\$4m over four years)



### **Implementation progress**

#### **Goal 4** – Clearer roles, strengthened accountability & coordination

- New regional Catchment Partnership Agreements
- First Annual Catchments Summit will take place on 29 June 2017.
  - Theme is 'Working Better Together'.

#### **Goal 5** – Improved monitoring, evaluation & reporting

- CMA annual condition reporting guidelines
- Working on measures and standards for information, data and reporting



#### Improved State-wide strategy and investment

\$22m allocated over 4 years for OCOC.

- \$200m over 4 years invested in improving health of waterways in regional Victoria
- \$48m for a sustainable irrigation future
- \$5.4m for flood and emergency risk resilience
- \$37.3m over 4 years is provided toward CMA corporate and statutory functions.
- \$86.3m over four years Victorian Biodiversity Plan and other reform initiatives
- \$18m in 2016-17 over four years support for Victorian Landcare Program.

This multi-year funding provides certainty to the Victorian NRM sector and gives opportunity to leverage and build on current and future Australian Government investment
